Sy Holzer is regional president of PNC Bank in Pittsburgh. He has overall Pittsburgh-based client, community and employee responsibility. His responsibilities include corporate and institutional banking, business banking and wealth management in Western Pennsylvania. He also oversees financial services relationships with all large government entities, higher education institutes and labor unions throughout the ten-county Southwestern Pennsylvania market, PNC's largest.

Holzer joined the bank in 1971 as a management trainee and then held positions of increasing responsibility in corporate and community banking. He was elected vice president in 1987 and senior vice president and manager of the Community Banking division in 1989. In 1991, Holzer was named senior vice president and manager of the Commercial Banking Division. He was elected executive vice president in 1994. In 1996, Holzer was given corporate-wide responsibility for Commercial Banking, Health Care, Higher Education and Public Finance. He was named president of PNC Bank, Pittsburgh, in May 1997.

Active in the community, Holzer is chairman of the University of Pittsburgh Cancer Institute, as well as a member of the board of directors of the UPMC Cancer Center. He was appointed by Pennsylvania's governor to serve on the Board of Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh. He serves on the Board of Visitors for the Katz Graduate School of Business and the School of Pharmacy at the University of Pittsburgh. He also serves as vice chairman of the Pittsburgh Regional Alliance (PRA). Additionally, Holzer serves on the boards of directors of the Bethany Board of Trustees, Family Communications D/B/A Fred Rogers and the Pittsburgh History and Landmark Foundation. He was appointed to the Pennsylvania Supreme Court Judiciary Advisory Council by the Chief Justice. He was named Vectors/Pittsburgh Man of the Year in Finance.

Holzer is a graduate of Duquesne University, where he received a bachelor of science degree in economics. He is a graduate of Stonier Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University and the University of Pittsburgh Katz Graduate School of Business – Management Program for Executives.
